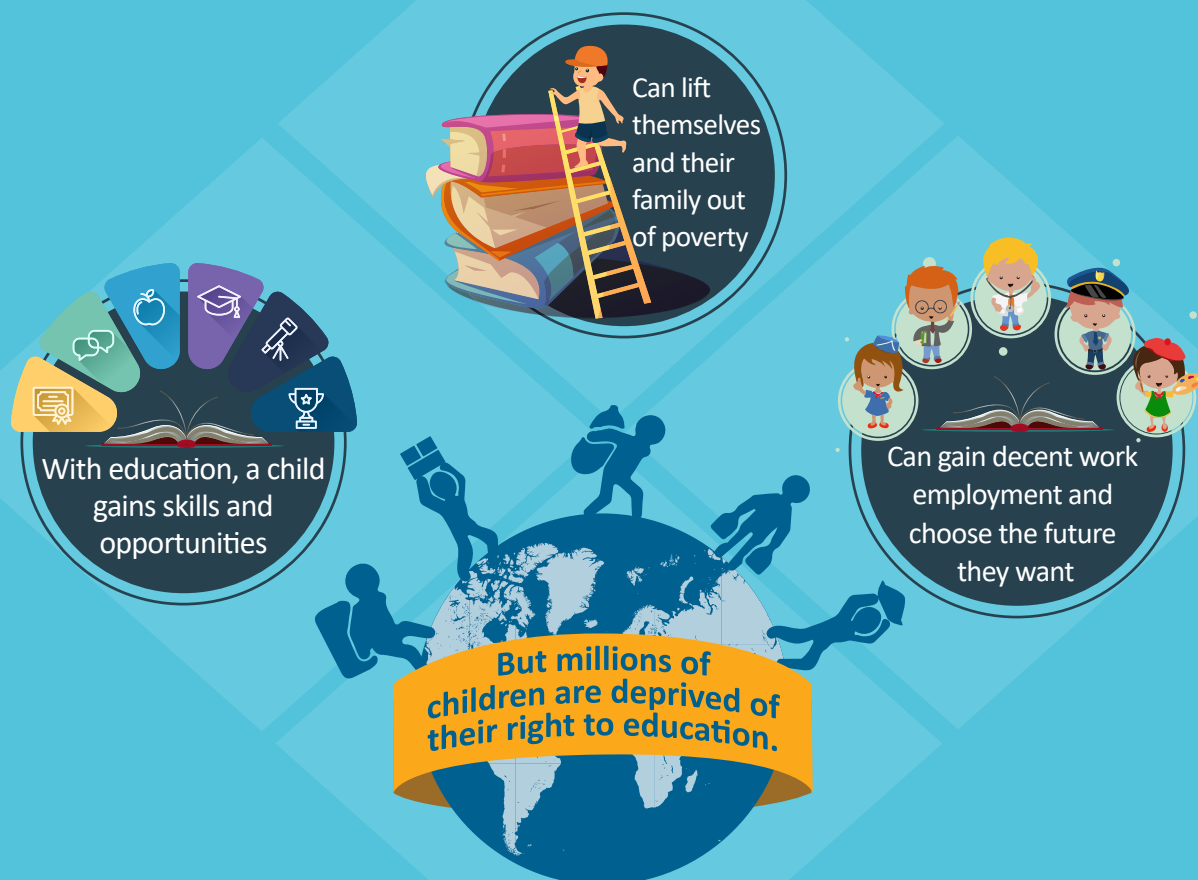


No to child labour

Yes to quality and inclusive education



What can we do?

To prevent more children from getting pushed into child labour and to withdraw child labourers from work and enrol them in schools, we must ensure the following:

Inclusivity



All vulnerable and at risk children must be included during enrolment. Children withdrawn from work, must also be provided with informal education and then mainstreamed into formal education or vocational training.

Quality



Only quality education in schools where teachers are trained, infrastructure is child friendly and gender sensitive and student teacher ratio is balanced, only then children can perform better and are retained in schools.

Safety



Children must be able to travel to and attend school without fear of violence. Schools must also be kept safe, accessible and running during conflicts and disasters as well, as it is one of the first safety nets for children during fragile times.

Accessibility



Schools must be at a close proximity to children's home and public education must be free and of quality. Where education is not free, families and children must be supported to ensure no child is out of school. Additional costs such as of uniforms, books, stationary and meals must be eliminated as well.

Why not question your leaders and governments today if they are ensuring these rights to all children in the country?
